



Notice of Race

The 2014, 33rd Annual Governor's Cup Regatta will be held on the west side of Lake DuBay on August 16th, 2014. The launch area is the public ramp at the Portage County – Du Bay Park, 4501 County Road E, Junction City, WI. Lunch and the awards ceremony will be held in the Dock of DuBay Restaurant & Bar pavilion at [4522 County Rd E](#), next to DuBay Park.

Hosts: The Organizing Authority is the **Lake DuBay Sailing Association**. See www.saildubay.org.

Class: Open Portsmouth Handicap.

Rules: The regatta will be governed by the 2013-2016 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and the Prescriptions of US Sailing (<http://raceadmin.ussailing.org/Rules.htm>), (except as they are modified by the Sailing Instructions).

Eligibility: The regatta is open to all types of sailboats recognized by the latest US Sailing Portsmouth handicap ratings. Boats not recognized in the latest Portsmouth Yardstick must be recognized in a previous Portsmouth handicap table in order to be properly rated and allowed to race.

Entry/Fees: Entries shall be submitted on the official registration form, which can be found on the RACING page of the Lake DuBay website: www.saildubay.org. The entry fee is \$35 per boat. **Boats committing to race by August 1, 2014, either by notifying by e-mail to vice-commodore@saildubay.org or sending a registration form to the below address will receive a complimentary lunch for the skipper and one crew member. Additional lunches can be purchased for \$8.00 each.** The lunch will include broasted chicken, beans, coleslaw and pasta salad prepared by the Dock of DuBay Restaurant.

Check-In: Check-in will be at the public boat ramp at the Portage County – DuBay Park on the west side of Lake DuBay from 0800 to 0900. Each boat or representative must check-in to complete registration during this time frame.

Sailing Instructions: Sailing Instructions will be available at check-in. Amendments to the Sailing Instructions will be posted at the boat ramp.

Schedule of Races: A four race series is planned with two races in the morning, a break for lunch, and two races in the afternoon.

Scoring: The series will be scored as provided in Appendix A of the racing rules using the Low Point System.

Protests: A jury appointed by the Organizing Authority will hear protests and requests for redress.

Prizes: Keeper awards will be awarded to five top places. The overall Governor's Cup traveling trophies will be awarded to the top three places.
