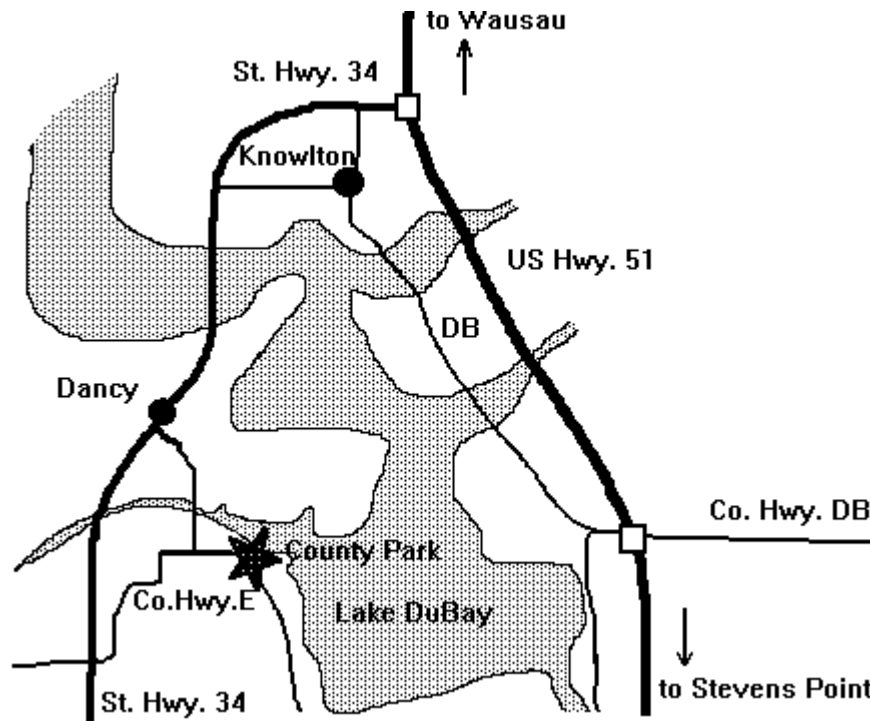

Race Instructions

1) Schedule of Events:

2) Race Management - The races will be conducted under and in accordance with the racing rules of the International Yacht Sailing Association as adopted by the United States Sailing Association except as altered by these sailing instructions. All boats must carry valid registration for the state of their home port and must comply with Wisconsin legal requirements for safety equipment.

3) Crew - The number of crew and approximate total crew weight shall remain constant for all races in the regatta.

4) 2 Turn Penalty Applies - The 2 turns penalty, as stated in Part 4 of the racing rules will apply. Acceptance of the penalty in no way exonerates a yacht from legal or financial liability. **Note: Hitting a mark is 1 turn penalty – the mark does not need to be rounded again. All penalty turns must be taken immediately.**

5) General - There are only two times that you can cross the start/finish line -- when you are starting and when you are finishing. Boats crossing the finish line when they are not finishing will be disqualified. All marks to be rounded will be left to Port.

6) Scoring Within Class Divisions - Scoring follows the most up to date Racing Rules Of Sailing. Trophies will be awarded to the top three in each class. If five races are sailed, a sailor's worst race will be thrown out.

7) Overall Regatta Standings - All sailors within all classes will be handicap scored together as one class. Traveling trophies will be awarded to the top three overall sailors.

8) Time Limit - Any yacht that does not complete the course within 90 minutes (uncorrected time) from the start of the last division will receive a DNF.

9) Shortened Course - If after the start, in the opinion of the Race Committee, a race will not be completed within the time limit, the course may be shortened. Shortening of the course will be signaled by sounding 2 blasts of a horn or gun and the raising of a visual signal. The finish will then be between the committee boat and the adjacent buoy. The line shall be crossed from the direction of the last regular mark of the course.

10) Starting Area - When a class is starting, all yachts not in that class **MUST KEEP CLEAR** of the starting area. This means keeping a distance from the starting line that is equal to or greater than the length of the starting line itself. Each yacht may enter the starting area when the 5 minute preparatory period *for its class* has begun.

11) One Minute Rule - will be in effect for all races. No boat may cross the starting line from either direction during the last 60 seconds before the start. Yachts that are on the course side of the starting line or its extensions, must round the buoy at either end of the starting line and cross to the pre-start side of the starting line **by crossing one of its extensions**. A dip start would be in violation of this rule.

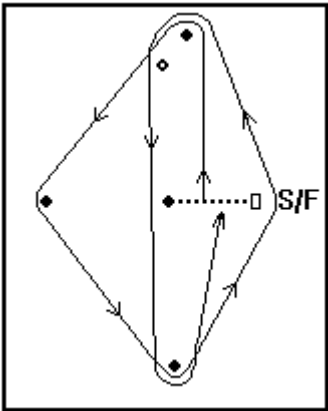
12) Number of races – A maximum of three races will be sailed on Saturday and a maximum of three races will be raced on Sunday. A maximum of 5 races will be sailed for the regatta.

13) Minimum and Maximum wind - Wind will be blowing at least 3 knots to start a race. If the wind dies to below 3 knots for a period of 30 min, that race will be abandoned. Wind will be blowing less than 15 knots to start a race. If the winds are excessively gusty, the race committee may abandon a race for safety.

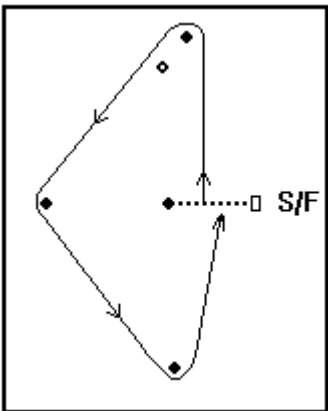

Course Descriptions

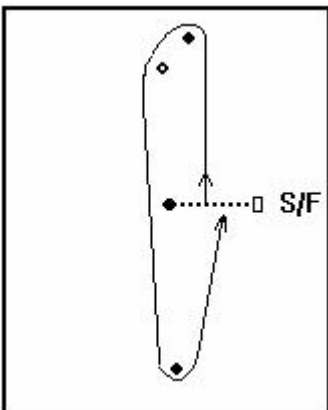
The courses to be used in this regatta are described below. The committee will display the appropriate symbol for each course during the preparatory period. Make sure that you check the committee boat before the start of **EACH** race.



G **Gold Cup Course** - The start and finish for the Gold Cup course are in the middle of the windward leg. You will beat 1/2 leg to the Windward Mark, reach to the Jibe Mark, reach to the Leeward Mark, full leg to the Windward Mark, run to the Leeward Mark, beat 1/2 leg to windward to the finish line.



T **Modified Triangular course** - The start and finish are in the middle of the windward leg. The starting line will be between a buoy and the committee boat. You will beat 1/2 leg to the Windward Mark, reach to the Jibe Mark, reach to the Leeward Mark, beat 1/2 leg to windward to the finish line.



W1, W1^{1/2}, W2 **Modified Windward Leeward Course** - The start and finish for the modified Windward\Leeward Course are in the middle of the windward leg. W1 is a beat to the windward mark, run to the leeward mark, and a beat to the finish (One time around to the finish.) W1^{1/2} is one and one half times around with a downwind finish, and a W2 is two times around with a windward finish.
